INCREASE IN COST OF SCHOOL MEALS FROM 30TH JANUARY

Last week you received a letter informing you of Aspen's intention to increase the cost of school meals. As from the Monday 30th January 2023 the new cost per day will be £2.45.

This increase will not effect those on universal free school meals (reception, Year 1 and Year 2) and those that are entitled to free school meals and is not available to those in Nursery (AM, PM and 30 Hours). If you like to pay weekly this will now be £12.25 per week, £49.00 every 4 weeks.



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PARISH NOTICES:

Message from Fr Joe: last October, I was part of an Occupational Health Assessment trial organised by the Diocesan Clergy Health and Well-Being Coordinator. This mental and physical health assessment was very thorough and the doctor I saw was very concerned about various results. She described me as 'the poster boy for burn-out' and signed me off work for two weeks. After taking those two weeks off in October, it has become clear that I am no longer able to sustain my work and ministry in the parish, and as Vicar General, without taking measures to recover and safeguard my health. As a result, I have resigned my post of Vicar General and will cease this responsibility at Easter. Also, from Easter until the end of July, I will be on sabbatical leave, taking a break from ministry, having served for 20 years in various places, and the last 5 years combining parish duties with the role of Vicar General. Part of this 3 ½ months break will be spent away, on retreat and a sabbatical training course, and for the rest of the time, I will remain resident in the presbytery at Sacred Heart, but will not be playing any part in parish life. The Pastoral Team will take full responsibility for the running of the parish and are well able to do so. Thank you to all who have expressed concern for my well-being and between now and Easter, I will concentrate on handing over my work as Vicar General to my successor, getting through to Easter in the parish, and then taking the time I need to recover my energy for future ministry.

<u>From the Pastoral Team and Parish Pastoral Council</u>: What does this mean for the parish? From Easter we will only have one full-time priest in the parish, Fr Philip, and Fr Marcus able to help out as his health permits. We will now begin looking at how the routine of the parish will need to change. Several things will need to be thought through:

• Each priest is only permitted to say 3 Sunday obligation Masses each weekend. At the moment, we have 6 across the parish.

• Each priest is entitled to a day off each week, so there will be one day in the week on which Mass is not celebrated, nor will it be possible to have requiem Masses on that day.

• Holy days, school Masses, First Holy Communion Masses the pattern of these celebrations will also need to change.

• People in the parish will need to take more responsibility for working with Fr Philip, Diane Williams our Community Coordinator and the whole Pastoral Team. This might include leading prayer and liturgy for various occasions, managing our buildings

• The plans for the immediate future will not include the closure of any of our three churches.

How will we do this? We are well placed in Holy Family Parish to adapt to changing circumstances. We already have in place several things that will help • A strong Pastoral Team who meet fortnightly and coordinate the day-to-day operation of the parish

• Very capable Parish Council and Finance Committee who oversee the strategic direction of the parish

• A full-time Community Coordinator in Diane Williams who is vastly experienced in the running of a parish

• A part-time Adult Formation Coordinator in Pauline Baptist who very skilfully supports catechists and organises different opportunities for us to grow in faith.

• In Frs Philip, Marcus and Deacon Anthony we have a lot of experience in parish ministry.

• A very large army of volunteers who give their time and talents in various ways. Over the next few weeks, the Parish Council will take us through the changes that are necessary. There will need to be some difficult choices and decisions, and, in many ways, any choice will mean some people lose out ---- routines will change, long-held practices will no longer be possible. All that is asked is an openness to consider other people as well as ourselves, a generosity of heart and to avoid this becoming a divisive moment in the parish. Any family faces challenges and change – including the Holy Family – and it will be a measure of us if we are able to work together as a parish community.

The bigger picture This changing scene is part of a wider story across the diocese and country. In summer 2022, ten parish priests retired or left ministry in our diocese and that number is likely to be repeated in 2023. We largely have the same number of churches etc that we had 30 – 40 years ago but with about half the number of priests to work in them. The diocese has reduced the number of parishes by merging existing parishes and a few churches are now earmarked for closure but a more fundamental shift is needed to allow the remaining parishes and churches still to function and grow. This will include a focus on lay people leading parishes and priests being part of a team serving a wide area, a renewed focus on the importance of schools, fewer Masses being offered as part of the parish routine Our Church is changing and Pope Francis is trying to lead the church to be less dependent on priests and more open to the world around us. We are part of this movement and change.

INDUSTRIAL ACTION

Following on from a letter last week you are now aware that members of the National Education Union (NEU) have voted for strike action. Other teaching unions (NASWT and NAHT) did not receive the required number of ballot papers and so will not be striking at this point. The NEU has identified six days of strike, four of which will affect our schools. These are:

- Wednesday 1 February 2023
- Wednesday 1 March 2023
- Wednesday 15 March 2023
- Thursday 16 March 2023

We are currently in the process of creating a plan for these days, which will hopefully minimize the disruption to learning. However, I would urge you to arrange childcare provision for your child(ren) in case they are not able to come to school. It may also be necessary to operate a different timetable for those pupils who are in school.
