<u>Priest's mobile phone numbers:</u> Fr Joe and Fr Phil both make their mobile phone numbers readily available – but this is for urgent calls only such as someone at the end of life wanting Anointing of the Sick, and for when they are on-call for the hospitals. Please do not use the priest's mobile phone numbers for routine calls – these should always go through the office and a message can be left if there is no answer. From Easter, Fr Joe is on sabbatical until the end of July and must not be contacted during this time.

Receiving Holy Communion: There have been a couple of incidents recently of people not treating the Sacred Host with sufficient reverence.

The Eucharist is a precious gift from God and is the Body of our Lord, so Communion must be received with respect and reverence.

Some simple guidance;

- If wearing gloves in church, remove them before coming forward to receive Holy Communion.
- If receiving on the hand, make a flat 'altar' with your hands to receive the Host.
- When the priest says, 'The Body of Christ', respond 'Amen'.
- When the host is placed on your hand, pick it up and consume it immediately do not walk off and consume off to the side.

Parents: if your child is coming up for a blessing – which is to be encouraged – please come up with them. Small children often come up and do not know what to do or where to go after receiving a blessing. Do not send them up with you remaining in the pew.

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Last Wednesday we celebrated World Book Day in school. The children were able to dress as their favourite book character or wear their pyjamas. Throughout the day, the children took part in a dance workshop to retell the story of Alice in Wonderland.
