

<u>Flower arrangers required</u>: thank you to those that have already offered. We require: 1 more at Sacred Heart, 2 more at St Augustine's and 4 more at Our Lady & St Edward's. This equates to once every 10/12 weeks. No experience necessary and expenses refunded. If you could spare an hour or two, please contact the office. Training will be given. Thank you.

Receiving from the Chalice; after an absence of three years, on Holy Thursday Night at the Mass of the Lord's Supper, we will have the opportunity to resume receiving the Precious Blood from the Chalice at Communion time. The Bishops have introduced this after assessing that any risk associated with receiving from the Chalice is no longer any greater than it was before Covid19 stopped the practice. The sharing of the Precious Blood from the one cup is a radical act of trust and communion – we are simply getting back to the practice of the Church for the past two millennia. Receiving from the Chalice is encouraged, as it means we share more fully in the symbolism of Mass; Jesus said 'take and eat, take and drink'. From Sunday 16th April, we will offer the Chalice at each Mass in the parish. If an individual does have cold or flu-like symptoms, it is advisable to not receive from the Chalice (a bit of common sense) and might even consider if coming to church is advisable. A reminder; after receiving the Host, we approach the Eucharistic Minister who will say 'The Blood of Christ'. We respond 'Amen' and take hold of the Chalice, sip, and then give it back to the Minister. The Minister will wipe the chalice after each person and rotate so the next person sips from a different side. The practice of Intinction (dipping the Host into the Precious Blood) is not permitted under any circumstances.

A big THANK YOU to Frs John McCay and Michael Brown who are helping out this weekend with Fr John saying the 10.00 and Michael the 9.30 and 11.30. This is to enable Frs Joe and Philip to both be at St Christopher's and stay around afterwards with people. We will give John and Michael a lovely welcome and won't mention that John supports Leicester City and Michael Derby County. Be gentle with them.

Change of heart and mind; after Easter, we will be going down from 6 weekend Masses to just 3. Although this will be a difficult time for many people the change of routine will be disruptive, we can all make it a positive process. It means that our churches are full and there will be a greater sense of community as we gather together to pray and worship. We can help this be being welcoming to people who will join a particular celebration for the first time. Being met by phrases such as 'hello stranger' or 'welcome to our church' is not helpful, particularly when people have been members of the parish for many years. Equally, people being told or given the impression that their offer of help is not required in a ministry such as reading, music, or altar serving, is very damaging and contrary to any sense of Christian community. Let's make sure we are open and welcoming to everyone who comes.
