
Vikings


The Vikings came from three countries in Scandinavia called Denmark, Norway and Sweden which are located in Northern Europe.



Key Vocabulary	Definition
Long boat or Longship	An open boat which is rowed by many oarsmen.
Shield	Protective piece of armor used by Vikings. Usually made from wood.
Invasion	An invasion is the movement of an army into a region, usually in a hostile attack that's part of a war or conflict.
Archer	An archer is a person who practises archery using a bow to shoot arrows.
Thatched house.	A thatched house is a house that has a roof that is made with dry vegetation such as straw and water reed.
Craftsmen	A person who is highly skilled in a craft.

Timeline of key events	
AD 793	The Vikings first invaded Britain in 793. They raided monasteries off the coast of Northumbria.
865	Great Viking Army from Denmark Invades England.
866	Danes capture York (which the Vikings called Jorvik) and make it their Kingdom.
876	Vikings from Denmark, Norway and Sweden settle permanently in England.
950	Vikings from Ireland, the Isle of Man and the Hebrides raid Wales, particularly the coastal monasteries.
1066	This was the Vikings last invasion, when William the Conqueror became King of England after the Battle of Hastings.
