asking for your help too. They have set a mission for our school to recycle batteries and if we are able to recycle enough we can win some free books for our school library.

The batteries we are able to accept are AA, AAA, C, D 9V batteries and button batteries. We cannot accept damaged or leaking batteries or batteries with connecting wires. Lithium and button batteries need



to be taped at each end so their contacts don't touch and we can store them safely. Please securely bag and send in your batteries for recycling with your child. The class that recycles the most batteries will win some extra playtime!
