


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WHAT'S IN THE NEWS?



<u>Memorial Masses in November</u>; At each of our churches, we will celebrate a Memorial Mass to remember all those who have died in the past year. We will be inviting families along who have had a funeral in the church, but everyone is welcome to come and remember loved ones. All the Masses are at 10.30 am and are followed by refreshments; Saturday 2nd November; Our Lady & St Edward's, Saturday 16th at St Augustine's, Saturday 23rd at Sacred Heart.

Blessing of graves; we will gather in Carlton Cemetery on Sunday 10thNovember, 3pm at the Cenotaph for prayers for the dead, followed by blessing of graves.

<u>Call of the Holy Father for Praver and Fasting for Peace</u>: The Holy Father asks that Monday 7th October, the memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary, to be a day of fasting and prayer for peace in the world. Accordingly, Bishop Patrick, together with all the Bishops across England and Wales, is asking parishes to do all they can to both inform parishioners of this message and request from the Holy Father, and to help as many as possible to participate in this action, calling for the gift of peace wherever there is conflict. In addition, the Holy Father will recite the Holy Rosary on Sunday at the Basilica of Sta Maria Maggiore. We are encouraged to recite the Rosary this coming Sunday, invoking *Our Lady Queen of Peace*, and uniting their prayer with that of the Pope; 'Let us walk together. Let us listen to the Lord and allow him to guide us by the "breath" of the Spirit.'

<u>School admissions to Catholic Secondary Academies (Year 7)</u> – Children born between 01/09/2013 and 31/08/2014. The deadline for submitting your application for a school place is 31st October 2024. Application forms are available on your 'home' Local Authority website. For every Catholic school you apply for if you wish your child to be considered and ranked under a faith criterion you should also complete a supplementary</u>

information form and return this form to the school by the deadline, (forms are available from the LA and the school). You MUST also include the supporting evidence as required with this form, eg baptism certificate (photocopies acceptable; if you do not have the evidence, contact the parish where your child was baptised for a copy certificate in good time). Failure to supply the required supporting evidence will mean your child is ranked in a lower criterion which may affect your chance of a place.

<u>Neighbourhood Rosary</u>; for the month of October, we have a special devotion to Our Lady. The Rosary will be prayed each Monday evening,7-7.45pm. Come and along and pray this beautiful devotion.

October 21st – St Joseph of Peace Convent, next to Sacred Heart Church Service of Anointing; Sunday 27th October, we will hold a service of Exposition and Benediction and Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. It will be at 4pm at Our Lady & St Edward's, with refreshments served afterwards. This Sacrament is for anyone who is physically or mentally ill, frail through illness or old age, struggling with an on-going illness and in need of healing. It is not to be thought of as the 'Last Rites' and just for those who are dying! Through the prayers, laying on of hands and anointing with the Oil of the Sick, we ask God's blessing and strength. Everyone who feels in need of this healing Sacrament is welcome.

This week's reflection from Pope Francis We consider those times when our prayers appear to go unanswered. We think, for example, of the heartfelt prayers we offer for our sick children, or for our friends who experience great pain. In our disappointment, we may feel that God is deaf to our pleas. Jesus taught us in the Our Father to ask for many things, but above all that God's will be done. Jesus shows us by his own example that God understands our sufferings, yet does not always immediately grant our wishes. In Gethsemane, Jesus offered a prayer that seemed to go unanswered; yet his complete trust in the Father's will led to our salvation and the glory of the resurrection. If there are times when we walk in the dark, guided only by the light of faith, may we never abandon our trust in the Father's will to make all things work together for our ultimate good.



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READING UPDATE

Reading is a skill we continue to develop throughout our lives, but starting this process as early as possible has significant benefits for our continued success as readers. This is why, as parents and carers, you play a vital role in supporting your child in becoming a fluent reader who is confidently able to apply their reading skills across all areas of their lives.

The teaching of reading and reading comprehension within the classroom is only part of a child's learning, and the value that is given to reading at home is equally important. Research suggests that children who read regularly outside of school perform significantly better in school assessments and so your support at home is essential in ensuring that your child makes the progress they are capable of. You can help your child to achieve their full potential by listening to them read daily (for about 10/15 minutes), reading regular bedtime stories and by encouraging them to enjoy reading and sharing books together. Reading widely through all of these approaches will help develop your child's vocabulary, which in turn will make them more confident when reading more challenging books.

To help us track how much reading your child is doing at home, it is important that you sign their reading record every time you have listened to them read, along with a brief comment if you can. (This should be at least 3 times a week). Your support with reading at home is essential and only by working together can we ensure your child achieves their potential as a reader.
