Evolution and Inheritance

To revise how a characteristic of all living things is that they reproduce and have offspring of the same kind, as features in the offspring are inherited from the parents.

To revise the difference between sexual and asexual reproduction Y5. Due to sexual reproduction, the offspring are not identical to their parents and vary from each other.

To know that plants and animals have characteristics that make them suited (adapted) to their environment.

To know that if the environment changes rapidly, some variations of a species may not suit the new environment and will die. If the environment changes slowly, animals and plants with variations that are best suited survive in greater numbers to reproduce and pass their characteristics on to their young. Over time, these inherited characteristics become more dominant within the population. To know that over a very long period of time, inherited characteristics may be so different to how they were originally

that a new species is created. This is evolution.

To revise how fossils are formed (Y3) To know that fossils give us evidence of what lived on the Earth millions of year ago and provide evidence to support the theory of evolution.

To understand how more recently, scientists such as Darwin and Wallace observed how living things adapt to different environments to become distinct varieties with their own characteristics.
