Last week was very cold, if your child wears wellies to school when it is raining or snowing, please pack their school shoes for them to change in to. We know lots of children are wearing hats, scarves and gloves at this time of the year, please write their names in them so they can be passed back to them.

Last week some children bought home an attendance letter from Miss Bradshaw who is our Education Welfare Officer. We understand that there were lots of children who were poorly with the flu virus last half term who received the letter sharing that attendance had dropped below 90%. If your child is in school this term, their attendance will increase and they will no longer be classed as a Persistent Absentee (PA). Again, we ask parents to make medical appointments out of school time where possible this includes routine GP / dental check-ups and optician appointments. When this is not possible, we will expect to see evidence of appointment times to be able to authorise the absence from school. Children in year 5 will go swimming so need to bring their swimming kit each Wednesday. We celebrate our first school mass this morning at 9:30am in church, families are welcome to join us.

Please make a note of our remaining three INSET days this academic year. The first one is on Friday 13th February when staff from all the schools within Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Multi Academy Trust will come together. The others are 26th June and 27th July. School is closed for all children on these days.

The closing date for applications is Thursday 15th January. All applications must be made to your local authority. If you apply after the deadline this may reduce your chances of getting a place at your preferred school, particularly if it is popular. **Although your child currently attends our nursery, this does not guarantee you a place in Reception.** We have to follow the admissions criteria from the diocese so it is important you visit other schools and list them on your application too. Failure to do so will mean the City Council will place your child in a school where there is a place available and this could be further away for you to travel to.

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 18th – 25th January 2026: For 2026, the prayers and reflections for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity have been prepared by the faithful of the Armenian Apostolic Church, along with their brothers and sisters of the Armenian Catholic and Evangelical Churches. These resources draw upon centuries-old traditions of prayer and petitions used by the Armenian people, along with hymns that originated in the ancient monasteries and churches of Armenia, some of which date as far back as the fourth century.

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2026 extends an invitation to draw upon this shared Christian heritage and to delve more deeply into our fellowship in Christ, which unites Christians worldwide. Paul's epistles stress the importance of unity within the Church, urging us to live lives worthy of our calling with humility, gentleness, patience and love (Ephesians 4:1-3). Ephesians 4:4 summarises the teachings of Paul about unity, emphasising here, too, that the followers of Christ represent 'one body and one Spirit', united in a single hope. This metaphor signifies the Church as a unified entity transcending barriers of geography, nationality, ethnicity and tradition. Paul uses the metaphor of the Church being the Body of Christ to describe its unity within the diversity of its members.

The Diocesan Choir will reconvene under the baton of the newly appointed Director of Music at Nottingham Cathedral, Peter Siepmann. An initial singing morning is scheduled for Saturday 31st January, 11am -1pm in Cathedral Hall.
